

The Original Our Lady of Solace Shrine Church Organ

Originally built by J.H. & C.S. Odell - #29 (1865)

Rebuilt by Hilborne L. Roosevelt – Opus 204 (1884) – tracker action

Organ was originally installed in the original Second Reformed Church (a.k.a. First Reformed Church) in New Brunswick, New Jersey in 1865. It was rebuilt and enlarged as Roosevelt tracker organ Opus 204 in 1884 at the Second Reformed Church, and was acquired by Our Lady of Solace Shrine Church for its new church building in 1924.
